

Welcome to Homestead Learning! We appreciate the opportunity to share our heart and vision with you! Perhaps you have inquired about your child's learning opportunities or you are just simply curious about Homestead Learning. Regardless, we are happy to share our micro-homeschool with you!

Homestead Learning, LLC, established in 2024 by Alison Brady and Jenna Walker, blossomed from a shared desire to help children develop a lifelong love of learning. We believe that children thrive through trust and the space to "Let Grow." At Homestead Learning, our approach to education promotes autonomy, resilience, and critical thinking through self directed education, practical life skills and collaborative learning experiences with children of all ages. We believe that a well educated person is one who chases their curiosity with passion and enthusiasm. Encouraging this experience is a central goal that we pursue at Homestead Learning.

Homestead Learning is a homeschool microschool. This means that all of our students are declared homeschoolers by the state of Wyoming but they have designated this program to provide some or all of the instruction. A microschool is a small-scale, independent educational setting that typically serves a limited number of students across different grade levels. Homestead Learning serves 15 students daily in both full time and part time capacities.

A typical day at The Homestead looks and feels much more like a homeschool than your typical neighborhood public school. We join together every morning for reading or socratic discussion and then spread out into groups or individually to work on core academics. We value a long, flexible lunch break where the children can cook their meals, play outside or take a rest when needed. The afternoons are dedicated to projects and skill building until it's time to clean up and head home.

If you envision an *immersive, engaging and personalized* educational experience for your child, we hope you'll apply to join our family at The Homestead.

## **About Homeschooling In Wyoming**

Homestead Learning is dedicated to reviving traditional educational values in a contemporary context, reminiscent of the one-room schoolhouses of yesteryears. Emphasizing multi-age learning and collaborative environments, the school aims to deepen children's understanding of academic subjects while simultaneously equipping them with invaluable life skills essential for real-world success.

Alison and Jenna take pride in offering a homeschool-like environment to the community; a sanctuary where families can cultivate their children's growth at their own pace. Through Homestead Learning, they aspire to give back to the community by providing a nurturing educational setting that celebrates the uniqueness and potential of every child.

**Wyoming state statute 21-4-101(a)(v):** *"A home-based educational program means a program of educational instruction provided to a child by the child's parent or legal guardian or by a person designated by the parent or legal guardian. A home-based educational program must meet the requirements of a Basic Academic Educational Program, which is defined in State Statute 21-4-101(a)(vi) as a program providing a sequentially progressive curriculum of fundamental instruction in seven subjects: reading, writing, mathematics, civics, history, literature, and science."*

#### State of Wyoming: Required Educational Hours

- Kindergarten. A minimum of 450 hours
- Elementary. A minimum of 900 hours

**Homestead Learning Will Work With You!** We offer a learning environment that will work with each family to fulfill the state and school district requirements. While we understand that we will not complete all hours within the school session; we will provide each family with a log to track hours of learning at home. Learning at home can be fun and engaging and can be incorporated into activities of daily living!

**Ages For Homestead Learning:** Currently we are accepting children between the ages of 4 and 10. We hope to expand in the future and will eventually offer through age 18. Children who are accepted into the Homestead Learning community will be guided through all of the state home-based educational requirements. For the ages of 4 - 6, we will place more emphasis on learning through play and building a strong foundation of phonemic awareness to help them flourish into strong readers. They will be immersed in thematic units that connect all of the traditional school subjects in meaningful ways. Children ages 7 - 10 will be guided through curriculums to learn math, social studies, language arts, and science; but the emphasis will be project-based learning in a multi-age environment. The younger children, when ready, will advance to learn with the "older kids."

# Tuition

### 100% Family Funded

Unlike our local public schools and faith-based private schools, we are 100% family funded. This means that we do not receive any funding from taxpayer education dollars (state or federal) nor any church affiliated charities or subsidies. Please keep this in mind as you are comparing our school program to others in the community.

#### We are intentionally different!

Because our pricing is 100% family funded, we have full control over our teaching methods! This means we're free to create programs tailored to each student's needs, without the constraints of outside regulations or strings attached. We do accept donations to our nonprofit organization "IntentionED" to grow our resources and provide scholarships for families in need. We promise that we will never accept any donations that apply mandates on our teaching methods or curriculum.

- 1. 4 day school week: \$7,965.00 Limited Time Discount! \$5,976.00 (\$664 monthly)
- 2. 3 day school week: \$5,904.00 Limited Time Discount! \$5,022.00 (\$558 monthly)
- 3. 2 day school week: \$3,915.00 (\$435 monthly)
- 4. Single Day Membership: \$220 monthly \*Ages 4-18 welcome\*

First month tuition fee due within 5 days of acceptance

\$100 Registration Fee due at time of enrollment

\$600 Annual Curriculum Fee (2 - 4 school day students), due within 5 days of acceptance \$200 Annual Single Day Supplies Fee, due within 5 days of acceptance

Payment options include an annual upfront payment, per-semester payments due on the 1st, or monthly installments. If students are absent or out for vacation, payments are expected. Registration, curriculum, and first month fee are non-refundable.

Forms of Acceptable Payment: Cash or Check OR pay online with added processing fees





# Founding Families Club

We are excited to introduce the Founding Families Club, a membership program offering special benefits and pricing for families who commit to our new enrollment options.

#### **Limited Time Discount**

For the 2024-2025 school year, we are offering a one-time, limited discount rate for all families enrolling in the 3 or 4-day per week option. **This offer will expire!** 

- 4-day per week option: \$5976
- 3-day per week option: \$5022

#### **Founding Families Club Tiers**

- **Tier 1:** The first 3 students to commit and pay by August 1st will lock in the discounted rate for the entire duration of their child's time at Homestead Learning.
- **Tier 2:** The next 3 students to commit and pay by August 8th can lock in the discounted rate for the next 5 years, with the last year of the discounted rate being the 2028-2029 school year.
- **Tier 3:** The final 3 students to commit and pay by August 15th can lock in the discounted rate for the next 3 years, with the last year of the discounted rate being the 2026-2027 school year.

#### **Important Note**

- The Founding Families Club tiers and discounted rates are only available for families enrolling in the 3 or 4-day per week options.
- Families who enroll in the 1 or 2-day per week options are not eligible for the Founding Families Club.
- If a family un-enrolls their child from Homestead Learning and later re-enrolls, they will have to pay the current rate at the time of re-enrollment. The commitment must be consistent with no breaks.





## **Curriculum & Supplies**

### <u>Curriculum</u>

Curriculum will be tailored to the needs of each child based on the homeschool requirements for the State of Wyoming, which include Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, & Language Arts. You will be provided with a form to submit to the Campbell County School District at the start of the school year listing the chosen curriculum for your child. You are also welcome to provide additional curriculum with the consent of Homestead Learning. Please see page 5 for more details regarding our educational philosophy and age based curriculum.

#### School Supplies Included and Provided by Homestead Learning

We will have a wide variety of supplies available to the students which include, but is not limited to, crayons, markers, pencils, notebook paper, colored pencils, binders, notebooks, folders, glue, scissors, and construction paper. There will be 1 to 2 computers available for students to use. Children are welcome to bring additional supplies as needed.

### Field Trips

Library, gardens, nurseries, farms, ranches, museums, and parks. ALL full time and part time students are welcome on Field Trip Days. Some trips may be an additional cost.

#### <u>Snacks</u>

Homestead Learning will provide one snack each day. Students may bring additional snacks to eat throughout the day.

#### Family Responsibilities

Families will be responsible for providing a backpack, water bottle, lunch, electronic device, headphones and any other items the student may need to be successful at Homestead Learning.





## **Enrollment Process**

#### If you are interested in having your child join us at Homestead Learning, please move forward with the steps listed below. If you have more than one child applying, please complete a separate application for each child.

- 1. Read the Introductory Packet in full.
- 2. Complete the Interest Form at www.homesteadlearning.org
- 3. Homestead Learning will contact you via email or phone to schedule a short call to discuss your interest in the program. We will then schedule an interview between the child, the parents and Homestead staff.
- 4. After the interview, we ask all interested families to join us for a tour and open house. Dates and times are currently to be determined.
- 5. After the campus tour, an Enrollment Form will be provided. If you are interested in having more than one child participate in Homestead Learning programs, please complete a separate enrollment for each child.
- 6. Families will receive an acceptance email within 1 week of completing the Enrollment Form.
- 7. A curriculum fee of \$600 and first month tuition (4 day \$885 \$664 OR 3 day \$656 \$558 OR 2 day \$435) is required via cash, check, or credit (*with added credit card fees*) upon acceptance for full time and part time students. Our Single Day Membership students will be required to pay a \$200 supplies fee once yearly at the time of acceptance.
- 8. Sign the Handbook and Contract.
- 9. Prior to the start of the school year, Homestead Learning will provide each family with the Home Based Education reporting form required by Campbell County School District.
